Minutes from the May general meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:32, May 5th, 1980. The treasurer reported that there appeared to be \$400 more than the checkbook showed.

Old business: Changes to the competition rules are not valid

because the time for approval had lapsed. A new meeting with adequate notice would be required to implement changes. Dave Cechowski will provide trophies for ice racing at the next meeting.

New Business: Barbara from the SCCA described the program for the Fire and Safety School sponsored by the SCCA. Tanacross paperwork is in order, but tech has not been arranged. Henry Hedberg agreed to coordinate efforts to select both a chief tech inspector and a site. Dwight announced a novice drivers school on 5/14 at 7PM. Pylons are to be distributed at tech from the back of Ray's truck. Susan said that there was 14lbs. of meat left over from the banquet that we could take to Tanacross. Henry suggested a \$100 entry fee and the executive committee approved. Baseball is causing problems, so the Autocrosses will have to be moved. Terry donated his truck to haul equipment, but requested volunteers to drive it to each Autocross. Soldotna race - Greg and Terry writing proposal for the Soldotna City Manager. Travis Maxim will organize corner crews, but not radios. Safety barriers needed for corner workers. A registrar is needed for race day. Paddock and Grid marshall needed. Cheryl suggested entering cars in the parade. There was some objections to this. Race is to close (in time) to the parade. The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 PM.

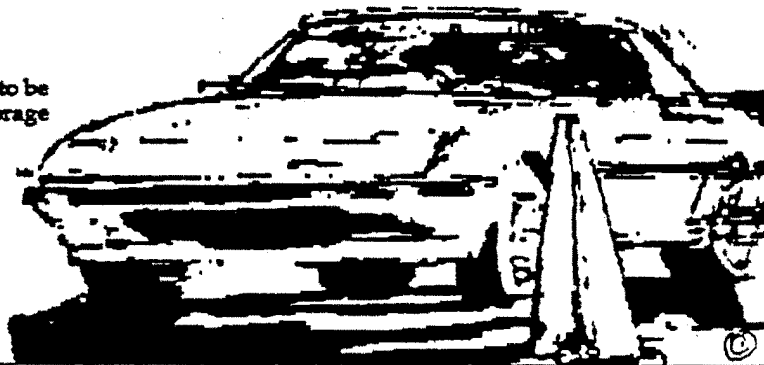
- You must compete in one (1) of the first three (3) events to be eligible to compete in the Championship Autocross in Anchorage on the 26th of August.

Come JOIN Us!

If you have always had that "Walter Mitty" feeling in you to become a race driver, then SCCA has just the thing to get you started. Autocrossing, or Solo II as it is also called, can give you a taste of all the thrills and excitement of motorsports without requiring you to invest a lot of time or money in getting started.

The word "solo" means that cars compete one at a time, against the clock, and that the driver who turns in the lowest time wins. Solo II events are relatively low-speed competitions that emphasize a driver's ability and the car's handling and agility through a short course defined by bright orange pylons, usually in a neighborhood parking lot. It sounds easy, but once you're good at it, victories can be won or lost by the blink of an eye.

No competition license is required and you can compete using the car you drive on the street—without having to make any modifications to it! You do need to use a helmet, but the Region will be glad to lend one to you. Solo II is a family affair—more than one person can take turns competing a car. The cars are divided into designated classes based on their potential performance and handling ability and each driver competes against the other drivers in his particular class. Trophies are awarded to the top finishers in each class at the completion of each season.
