D2! - DITTMAN ROLLS TO SECOND RONDY WIN

Dave Dittman proved that you make your own luck as he and co-driver Chad Yoshitomi dominated the GTO class at the 1994 Fur Rondy Grand Prix. In driving his Porsche powered Super Beetle to victory for the second straight year, Dittman provided a solid display of driving skills on a well prepared and mostly dry track.

Dittman was not without competition as runner-ups Jim Rogers and Dale Hirsch pitted their 911 Carrera against the improved efforts of Soldotna's Shawn Hutchings. GTU winner and two-class warrior Jim Hemmesch's 2.2 liter Super Beetle proved underpowered in the GTO class. Hemmesch battled Bruce Lee, the VW Scirocco driver, in both classes. The two provided some of the closest racing

of the weekend as they slugged it out, trading heat wins over the course of the two day event.
