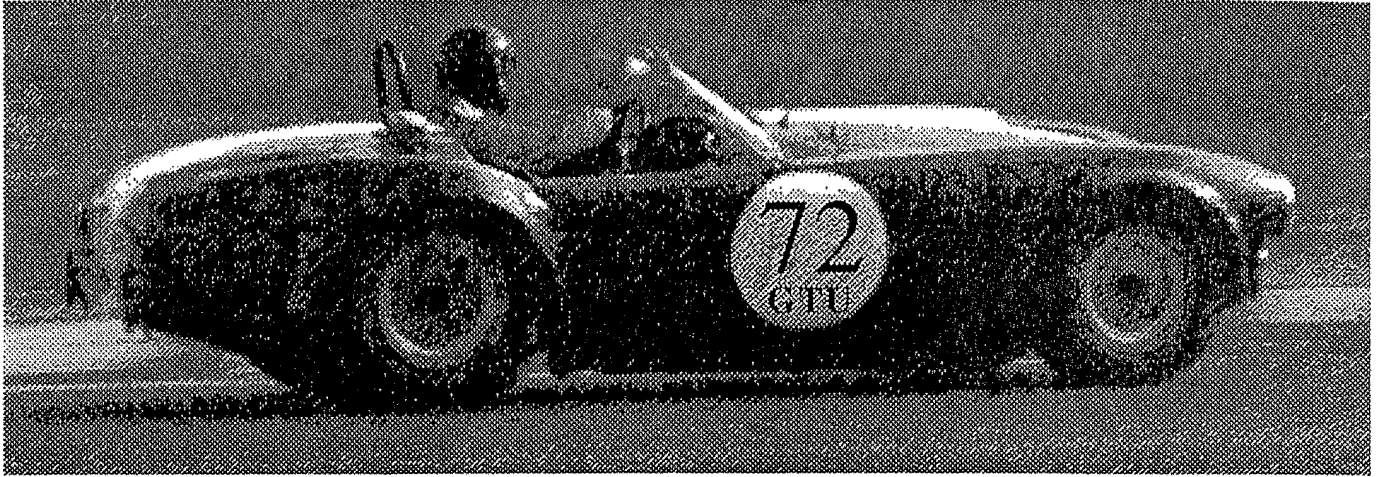

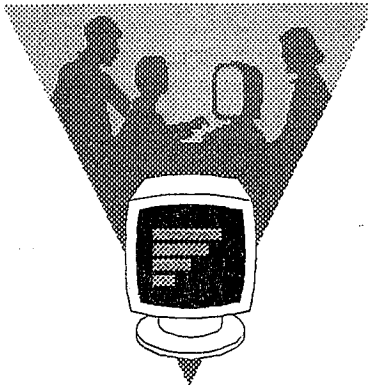

VIRTUAL RACING

Indy Car Racing Comes to Anchorage

Have you always wanted to experience the thrill of Indy Car driving but never thought it possible? Would you rather be in control of a Lola T9300 powered by a Ford-Cosworth XB or a Penske Chevy93 with a Chevy Indy V-8/C? Have you dreamed about driving at Sears Point Raceway or the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course? Did you think you would participate in the Monaco Grand Prix or cruise the Surfer's Paradise in Australia? Well now you can do it any time of the year for free! Yes, all of these circuits and more are at your disposal to practice on and compete in at no charge to you and with out ever leaving Anchorage!

It sounds to good to be true, doesn't it? Thanks to some great computer geeks, virtual racing is possible. Papyrus Software has developed a program called Indy Car Racing that is available for IBM compatible computers. This means that you don't really do anything more than sit in front of a computer screen with your hands on the controls as you race the great courses you have always wanted to. I first saw this game as a demo disk that came in some computer equipment that we sell at Alaska Used Computer Source. I was not very impressed, because it seemed like a typical arcade style program and was limited to running around a circle track (Michigan International Speedway.) It was not until I was helping Kevin Seckel, ASCC Treasurer, with his home computer that I realized that this was more than a game of PONG. Kevin introduced me to the full software game

package that included many decisions that had to be made with regard to the set up of the vehicle. What I realized was that this was more than a game, it could actually be used as a learning tool.

Several months later, I found myself helping Bryan Doughty, ASCC Vice President, with his computer at Euro Car Services. Some other club members were hanging out (e.g. Jim Hemmesch and Chad Yoshitomi, who I had just built a computer for) and talking about this cool CD ROM game that Peter Seliba had purchased and how they had to get their hands on it before he left for vacation. The Software was successfully commandeered and low and behold, it was the same game that had been haunting me. Finally, I actually checked it out in more detail

and the current version will allow two people to race on the same track simultaneously!

As you might have guessed, that many racers in one room at the same time came to one conclusion. Competition!

CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON

Two machines have been set up side by side for winter competition. A cable has been strung between the two so that racing is done live between two human drivers and a dozen or so computer simulation drivers like Paul Tracy and Bobby Rahal. The season consists of approximately 12 races around the world which can be set up to a percentage of race distance up to 100% of the actual real life distance (500 miles or 250 laps at Michigan International Speedway.) Each driver has many chassis/power plant choices to make as well as things like brake bias, tire size and pressure, fuel capacity, front and rear wing angles and suspension adjustments to name a few. All transmission choices have 6 gears worth of ratios to pick, and most engines will reach 12,500+ RPM before blowing (keep an eye on your turbocharger boost.) For the faint at heart, automatic shifting and braking is available.

We thought it would be fun to get a season of this stuff in this winter. If you are remotely interested, give me a call in the daytime and I'll put you on a separate list for mailers that pertain to this activity.

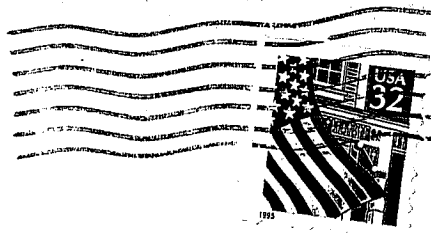
